2 key successes observed towards driving the enablers for integration	<p>a) Collaborative leadership and shared governance - This has proved a key strength and 2024/25 has seen a streamlining of the place-based governance structure to produce a more robust model that is still evolving.</p> <p>b) Population approaches: Development of the Integrated Neighbourhood Teams has provided the foundation for a Population Health approach to be taken to addressing different need across the borough.</p>
2 key challenges observed towards driving the enablers for integration	<p>a) Collaborative leadership and shared governance - Maintaining a collaborative leadership at a time of increasing financial hardship is a challenge when the pressure for organisations to resort to self-preservation can be powerful.</p> <p>b) Digital records, data and shared information - The availability of timely and accurate data to inform timely decision making continues to be an issue, although 2024/25 has seen improvements as new systems, i.e., Cerner and Optica, become embedded.</p> <p>c) Sustainable care provider market - This is and will continue to remain critical to the sustainability of the health and care system. Key issues include recruitment and retention of a suitably qualified workforce.</p>
