

→ Hillingdon Cycling Strategy – Year 1 review

Introduction

A commitment within the Hillingdon Cycling Strategy is to review the document on an annual basis and publish a short summary, detailing continuing works and any additions/changes.

Year 1 progress

- Children trained to Bikeability Level 2: **1,103**
- Adults who undertook Cycle Skills Training: **58**
- Dr Bike sessions held: **17**
- School Cycle Parking grants issued: **9**



Years 1-2: Action plan review

- **Action:** Delivery of a cycle route between West Drayton and Brunel University London

Current progress: Design works are in progress

- **Action:** Upgrade of the canal towpath between Rockingham Road and Oxford Road, Uxbridge

Current progress: Completed

- **Action:** Improvement to some of the canal access points in Yiewsley and Cowley

Current progress: Three access points completed

- **Action:** Road safety improvements at the Stockley Road roundabout

Current progress: In progress

- **Action:** Improvements to the existing cycleway alongside the A312 Parkway

Current progress: Design works and safety considerations being undertaken
